## Consumers Condemn DWASA Water, but the Problem goes much Deeper

The water provided by Dhaka's utility service, Dhaka Water and Sewerage Authority (DWASA), has come under fresh scrutiny following a report lambasting the agency's service and water quality. Five water treatment plants in the city supposedly make the water consumable. But the pipeline used to distribute the water often renders the process pointless. While DWASA has been working on various projects to improve its network, worn out and underdeveloped pipelines continue to provide a steady supply of dirty water to angry consumers. The acute scarcity of water in Dhaka city fades the mega-development story of the regime.
